Student Wellbeing and Learning Diversity news

Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships

At Glowrey we have timetabled, explicit teaching of the 'Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships' learning materials. This program is about embedding a culture of respect and equality in our school and wider community. The children learn problemsolving skills, to develop empathy, how to support their own wellbeing and build healthy relationships with others.

UNIT 1 - EMOTIONAL LITERACY

Emotional Literacy is the ability to understand, express and manage our own emotions, build empathy and to respond appropriately to the emotions of others. Building a large vocabulary of emotions helps to increase emotional literacy, build self-awareness and empathy for others.

Here is a small snapshot of what was covered in UNIT ONE:






YEAR 1 & 2 INCURSION






Classes use the 'Bear Cards' as a visual tool to help children describe how they are feeling/have felt throughout the day.


This term the Year 3 children have been looking at strategies to manage challenging situations. They were fortunate enough to take part in an incursion where they were faced with many challenges, like building a tent with no instructions, shape puzzles and slingshotting as many balls into a bucket as possible. These challenges encouraged children to manage their own emotions and frustration whilst using the strategies that they have been learning throughout their Inquiry unit and Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships.



SENIOR SCHOOL WELLBEING WORKSHOPS

In these whole class workshops, students were encouraged to focus on recognising uncomfortable emotions such as 'worry or anxiety'. The students then learnt some practical strategies to work through stressful or challenging situations and take action towards bravery and resilience.










Japanese Club By Hiroko Sensei


Japanese Club by Hiroko Sensei (博子先生)



Maths Year 2








To end the term the Year 2 students have been learning about Time. We have been looking at seasons, calendars and the months of the year.

During the drive we collected:

- . Bars of soap (160)
- . Hand Sanitiser (77)
- . Hairbrushes (64)
- . Toothpaste (81)
- . Toothbrushes (109)
- . Deodorant (64)
- . Shampoo (63)
- . Body Lotion (56)

This adds up to a total 674 toiletry items!



Before attending the Salvation Army workshop at the Year 5 and 6 camp, we decorated the bags that the toiletries would be packed in with messages of hope. An example of this message was 'Even though times are tough, we care about you. God will never forget about you and you are special'.

On the first day of camp, we had the Salvo's workshop. We learnt about the history of the Salvation Army, we did an activity together and lastly we packed the bags for the less fortunate.


