Dear Parents and Guardians,

Can I begin by congratulating all of our students who have really settled into their learning this term. I am constantly impressed by the way our students have engaged in their learning tasks and meeting the challenges that are set by the staff. I would also like to acknowledge the excellent behaviour of our students as we start a new school year and their willingness to follow the Glowrey School Rules. A special mention to all of our wonderful prep students who have started just so well and are getting used to the routines of school. Also a very warm welcome to the new students that have started at Glowrey in other year levels.

On a staffing front I would like to welcome our new staff this year to Glowrey; Miss Melanie Brotto (Year 1B), Mrs Yolanda Grillo (Year 1GS), Miss Carla Scobell (Year 3S), Mrs Mara Sambucco (Visual Arts), Mr Joe Gravina (Learning Support).

I would like to thank you for your patience and assistance with the dropping off and picking up of children. I am very aware of the challenges with congestion at the moment especially in Baltrum Drive. We have been advised in due course this road will be widened however the key messages I would ask all parents to follow to ensure the safety of everyone are as follows.

- Strictly adhere to the 40km hour speed limit around the school
- When entering the staff car park to pick up and drop off students <u>PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE YOUR CAR</u>
 <u>UNAATTENDED FOR ANY REASON</u>. If you need to take children into the school grounds you are asked to
 park in the adjoining streets and walk them in.
- Adhere to a maximum of 5km hour speed limit in car park.
- Adhere to the council 'kiss and drop' zones and remain with your car.
- Do not park in designated NO STANDING zones.

You will have noticed some significant building works that are now well underway to further expand our facilities. This project will see nine new classrooms, science project space, additional toilet block, large shared learning spaces, student wellbeing and counsellor offices, significant undercover areas around the building and an expanded car park. MATHEMATICS PREP & YEAR 1

Foundation

Look around, pick out numbers on road signs, number plates, houses etc

Ask them to tell you the number. Do they know 1 more or 1 less than the number. Is the number bigger or smaller than another number e.g. 5

SHARED ZONE



Can the count the number of pavers on a path as they step on them?
Can they guess how many steps to the front door/playground/car?



Can they guess how many sips they will need to take to finish their glass of water?

Can the count the amount of cars in their street?



Point out a flower and ask how many flowers are on it.

Ideas for encouraging your child to see Mathematics in the world

"Without mathematics, there's nothing you can do. Everything around you is mathematics.

N.B. Year levels are a rough guide, your child may try any of these activities, either higher or lower grade levels

Year 1

Can they say the numbers on the road signs? Do they know what 10 more/10 less that the road sign number would be?



Look at the numbers on the houses in a street. If the numbers go up and down by two, point to a house and ask them what are the house numbers either side of that house.



Look at a digital clock, what numbers can your child see?

Can they find something in their house that there is more than 10 of?



Look at a calendar, point to a day. Ask them: What day it will be tomorrow? What day was it yesterday? What date is it? What date will it be tomorrow?

MATHEMATICS YEAR 2



Look at the clock. Ask them to tell you when it is half past a number, or quarter past a number.

Get them to write a diary with the days of the week, saying events that they know will occur on those days. Can they say whether they will happen in the morning, afternoon or night?



When at the shops find 3 items that cost less than \$1. Find an item that costs exactly \$2.50.



Look at road signs, how many more to 100. What is double/half the number on the road sign? What is

1/10/100/1000 more than the number on the road sign?



MATHEMATICS YEARS 3 TO 6

Year 3

Look at the temperature each day. What is the weather likely to be like? Will they need a jumper, rain coat etc



Look at number plates. Can they mentally work out how many more to 1 000/10 000?
What is half/double the number on the number plate?





Challenge your child

Always ask them how they worked it out, even if their answer is wrong. Often in explaining their thinking a person realises their error.



Year 4

Look at the clock, how many hours and minutes till you go to bed/school/an outing?



Look at the calendar, how many days till the end of the month?

How many days/weeks till their birthday?

Look for opportunities in the world to use multiplication



e.g. buying bread rolls.
A bread roll costs 35c, how much will it cost for 8 bread rolls? What about if you give the shopkeeper \$5/\$10/\$50, what change will you get?

Year 5



Look at the temperature. Can they work out the average weekly/monthly temperature? What chance is there of rain? Were the meteorologists correct?



Look at an item at the supermarket. How much would it cost to buy 4/5/6 etc of them? If you gave the shopkeeper \$20 what change will you get?



Buying meat from the butcher. If adults eat approximately 175g of meat and children eat 90g of meat, how much meat do you need to buy for a family meal? Look at the price of the meat per kilogram. How much will it cost?

Year 6



Look at shop signs that discuss percentage off items. How much will the item now cost?

How many school days left in the term/year?

Look at fruit/veg cost per kg. Get your child thinking about mass of items e.g. If 1 kg is 6 apples, how many apples in 3.5kg?



Think about the cost of petrol. If you have a car with a petrol tank that holds 65 litres, approximately how much will it take to fill it/half fill it/ quarter fill it if petrol is \$1.89 per litre?
