


YEAR 3 - INQUIRY

In Year 3 the students explored how the foods and fibres we purchase as consumers are created from its raw produce into processed forms. They thought about how products are advertised and targeted for specific audiences.

In small groups the students designed and marketed their own 'new' product from the raw product of wheat, potato or wool. They then presented their products to the year level.






















YEAR 6 - MENTAL COMPUTATION

"The Fraction Activity Game"

In Year 6C, during our fractions activities, we played "The Fraction Activity Game" for our mental computation practice. To play the game, every student uses a template that includes two empty fractions. Each student is only allowed to use the numbers 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 to fill in the empty fractions on the template. We have to plot numbers to fill in the numerator and denominator on the template.

When a player fills in the template, you have to aim to make the total equal as close to 2 as possible. So, we have to use some of the numbers to make two fractions that when added together are close to 2. Each student has to try to find as many different answers as we can, and we have been using our prior knowledge of adding fractions, adding fractions with the same denominators, adding fractions with like denominators and converting improper fractions to mixed numbers.
