


Snap shot of activities from various units of the Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships






Year 1 students identify situations that make them feel comfortable/positive emotions as well as some goals on how they can continue to build their personal strengths.



Year 3 students identify skills that are helpful for working as a team.


Year 3 students identifying how different scenarios can trigger positive/comfortable emotions of negative/uncomfortable emotions






















Year 4 Students identify selfcalming strategies they can use to help them through challenging emotions
